Note to Applicant

- Open Air Burning is regulated by Division B, Sentence 2.4.4.4. (1) of the Ontario Fire Code- O. Reg. 213/07 and by Municipality of Chatham-Kent By-law 107-2016. Applicants must comply with these and all other applicable laws when performing Open Air Burning. Please read and review the by-law please by visiting our website at <u>www.chatham-kent.ca</u>.
- Read and complete all particulars of the application including a sketch. Print, Sign, then return the completed application to the respective Municipal Service Centre.
- The Chatham-Kent Fire & Emergency Services Division (CKFES) will review the application and return it to the Municipal Service Centre with a decision to either approve or deny the application.
- Please allow 7 (seven) business days for processing.
- The applicant must contact the Chatham-Kent Central Fire Dispatch Centre at <u>519-352-1100</u> with the approved permit number <u>prior</u> to commencing burning and <u>after</u> the fire is extinguished.
- THIS PERMIT SHALL BE VALID FOR A MAXIMUM OF TWELVE (12) MONTHS.

Disclaimer:

It is your responsibility to ensure you are aware of, and fully comply with the requirements of the Open Burn By-law – Number 107-2016. Chatham-Kent Fire & Emergency Services will not normally visit your property before granting a permit. An enforcement officer may prohibit any open-burn activity at your property if in his or her judgement they believe it to be unsafe. The Municipality may also take further enforcement action as listed in Section 10 – Offences, under By-law 107-2016 if you are not complying with the requirements.

By signing you understand and accept the following:

- You have read and are complying with the requirements of Open Burn By-law #107-2016
- You have completed the required application and your property is within the prescribed parameters listed in the By-law You understand the fire cannot create a nuisance for other persons such as your neighbours and to co-operate with anyone who raises
- concerns as to the open burn.
 The rights of the Municipality of Chatham-Kent to enter your property and enforce the requirements of the By-law
- You may be liable for the costs of any activity to manage the results of an unauthorized burn at your property
- You are the owner of the property or authorized agent (with proof) for which you are applying for a burn permit
