



Chatham-Kent Welcome Week September 9th-18th, 2022

Purpose: To connect newcomers to services in Chatham-Kent, to celebrate their contributions to the community through storytelling, and to promote diversity in our community. The week acts as a celebration, while efforts to support and welcome new residents to Chatham-Kent continue throughout the year.

Media Coverage:

CK Welcome Week was covered by local and regional media, including: 1 Chatham Daily News article, 1 Chatham Voice article, 1 Blackburn News article, 2 Sydenham Current articles, 1 CKXS FM article and 1 Yahoo Life article.

Promotion:

CK LIP developed the Chatham-Kent Welcome Week webpage to showcase events and programs that were hosted by CK LIP Council members and other community organizations. We increased our reach on the CK LIP Facebook page by 570%; we increased CK LIP Facebook page visits by 244% and CK LIP Facebook page likes were up by 800%.
