2379 Talbot Trail



Date Added to Registry: 18-Jan-2010

Historic Period and/or Date of Erection: Circa 1828

Historical Significance: This house was originally built by the Coatsworth family. It is likely the second oldest known structure in the municipality.

Architectural Significance/Description: Although difficult to see from the photo, this is an excellent example of an early and pure form Georgian home without later Neo-Classical or Classical Revival embellishments. The windows look like they could be original to the house and the entrance way is another exemplary characteristic of the dwelling.

Contextual Significance: The home is located along the historic Talbot Trail road.

Date Added to Registry: 18-Jan-2010

Historic Period and/or Date of Erection: Circa 1840

Historical Significance: This residence is one of the oldest remaining structures in Romney Township.

Architectural Significance/Description: This home is one of the few brick Regency dwellings remaining in Chatham-Kent. This particular style of Regency is extremely rare in the municipality as it resembles homes commonly found in Kentucky.

Contextual Significance: The abode is located along the historic Talbot Trail.
